### Sabah in Malaysia-Indonesia Relations (2019)

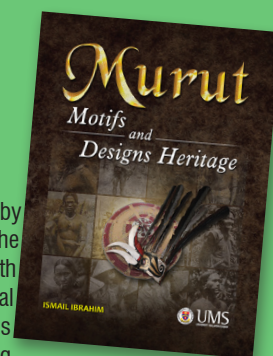
